



RAD

The Portland Police Department in partnership with the Amy St Laurent Foundation offers life savings self defense skills to women and children in the community. The program was started in 2002 and has been going strong ever since. Since its induction we have trained over 3000 women and children in how to keep themselves safe.

Camp POSTCARD

Camp POSTCARD is a program that is run by the Volunteers of America. It affords 160 kids from across the state a free opportunity to attend summer camp. The camp counselors are made up of off duty police officers and fire fighters. Portland PD has been represented for the last 8 years at camp.

- All Portland Schools: The coordinators and Youth Services Officer Behnke spend time in classrooms building relationships with the children. We are able to assist with student concerns that don't rise to a criminal level. We are also involved in bullying and mentoring programs.

- Involved in mentoring programs at the Boys and Girls Clubs, Long Creek Youth Development Center and schools

- The Root Cellar: Coordinators assist with their various programs targeted at youth in the neighborhood, as well as, their weekly food distribution program.
- Work closely with Juvenile Probation to ensure that the youth are getting the services that they need and being successful in the community
- Portland Housing Authority: We work together regarding families needing support in the community, as well as, communicating with the property manager about activity in the neighborhood and police concerns.

East End Kid's Catering Free Summer lunch program: Coordinators either run the program Monday through Friday or volunteer a day during the week in the neighborhoods we work in.

National Night Out: A unique crime/drug prevention program sponsored by National Association of Town Watch is celebrated in August. The East Bayside center partnered with Mayo Street Arts, Target, CPPC, PHA, Casey Family Services and area residents for a parade followed by a BBQ in Peppermint Park.

- Mayo Street Arts: Coordinators have various youth/community programs located at their facility.
- DHHS child protective services: Home visits either self-initiated or when contacted by CPS, as well as, attends family team meetings and supports families within their neighborhoods.
- Wayside Food Program: Coordinators work together on the healthy snack program, which allows the policing centers to give out healthy snacks to children and to "check in" with them.
- Open House at Neighborhood Centers

Coordinators work closely with Police Officers, Middle Managers and Administrators in the Police Department. Examples are as follows:

- Work with the Community Policing Officers in their assigned communities as well as, the beat officers by doing research
- Work on Text-a-tips for their area, many times doing research about the tips
- Check police calls for service daily for any activity within their designated areas
- Work closely with the School Resource Officers
- Work with landlords and property managers, updating criminal trespass letters and assisting them with any issues in their buildings

Our Roles in the CPPC

- Assisting CPS caseworkers and other service providers with information concerning families, workers safety & home visits
- Support families in neighborhoods by connecting them to appropriate services
- Answer any policing related questions from the families and/or DHHS staff
- DHHS child protective services: Home visits either self-initiated or when contacted by cps, as well as, attends family team meetings and supports families within their neighborhoods.

What we can do for Parents as Partners

- Work collaboratively with the DHHS caseworker in conjunction with Parent Partner
- Assist PP with providing information regarding services available connecting within each neighborhood
